

ORDINANCE 20 - 04

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE, TEXAS, IN HUNT COUNTY, TEXAS, DECLARING UNOPPOSED CANDIDATES FOR THE OFFICES OF CITY COUNCIL MEMBER PLACE 1 AND CITY COUNCIL MEMBER PLACE 3; DECLARING EACH UNOPPOSED CANDIDATE ELECTED TO OFFICE; AND APPROVING THE ORDER OF CANCELLATION TO CANCEL THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION SCHEDULED TO BE HELD ON MAY 2, 2020; PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE CUMULATIVE OF ALL ORDINANCES; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Commerce, Texas passed Ordinance 2001 on January 21, 2020 ordering a General Election to be held on May 2, 2020 for the purpose of electing one at large Council Member for Place One (1), and one at large Council Member for Place Three (3); and

WHEREAS, Section 143.007 and Section 146.025, of the Texas Election Code, the deadline for filing applications for a place on the ballot and declaration of write-in candidacy have expired; and

WHEREAS, the City Secretary, in accordance with Section 2.052, Texas Election Code, has certified in writing that no person has made a declaration of write-in candidacy, and that each candidate on the ballot is unopposed for election to office; and

WHEREAS, given these circumstances, Subchapter C, Chapter 2 Election Code, authorizes the City Council to declare the candidates elected to office in May of 2020 and cancel the election;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. The following candidates, who are unopposed in the May 2, 2020 General Municipal Election, are declared elected to office, and shall be issued certificates of election following the time the election would have been canvassed in May of 2020:

Council Member
Place 1
Stephanie Muller

Council Member
Place 3
Anthony Henry

SECTION 2. The May 2, 2020 General Municipal Election is cancelled, and the City Secretary is directed to cause a copy of the Order of Cancellation which is a part of this Ordinance and Attached as Exhibit A to be posted on Election Day at the polling place, located at 1119 Alamo Street, Commerce, TX 75428, which would have been used in the election.

SECTION 3. It is declared to be the intent of the City Council that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence,

paragraph or section of this ordinance is declared invalid by the judgement or decree of a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections of this Ordinance since the City Council will have enacted them without the invalid portion.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and so it is ordained.

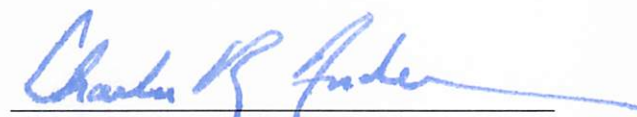
