

ORDINANCE NO. 2022 – 16

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE, TEXAS, RATIFYING THE ADOPTION OF THE FISCAL YEAR 2023 BUDGET THAT WILL REQUIRE RAISING MORE REVENUES FROM PROPERTY TAXES IN THE FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023 (“FY 2023 BUDGET”) THAN IN THE PREVIOUS FISCAL YEAR 2022 BUDGET; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council has, prior to its consideration and adoption of this Ordinance, adopted, by separate Ordinance, the Budget of the City of Commerce for Fiscal Year 2023 (“FY 2023 Budget”) which will commence October 1, 2022 and end on September 30, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Year 2023 Budget will require raising more revenue from property taxes than in the Budget of the City of Commerce for FY 2022 (“FY 2022 Budget”) and, as a result of the approval of the FY 2023 Budget, the Council finds that it must ratify the increased revenue from property taxes; and

WHEREAS, Section 102.007 (subsection c), Texas Local Government Code, provides that the adoption of a budget that will require raising more revenue from property taxes than in the previous year requires a separate vote of the governing body to ratify the property tax increase reflected in the budget, and that such vote is in addition to and separate from the vote to adopt the budget or to set the tax rate; and

WHEREAS, Section 26.4a of the City Charter allows for the adoption or amendment of a budget or the assessment of levy of taxes to be approved on the first reading; and

WHEREAS, in order to comply with that provision, it is necessary for the City Council to adopt this Ordinance;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COMMERCE:

SECTION 1. In accordance with the requirements of Section 102.007 (c), Texas Local Government Code, the adoption of the FY 2023 Budget, which will require raising more revenue from property taxes than in the FY 2022 Budget, is hereby ratified by the Commerce City Council in all things, thereby ratifying the property tax revenue increase reflected in the FY 2023 Budget. As such, the City Council of the City of Commerce declares:

Based on the tax rate of \$0.769326 per \$100 of assessed valuation:

“This budget will raise more total property taxes than last year’s budget by \$528,796 or 15.5%, and of that amount, \$32,138 is tax revenue to be raised from new property added to the tax roll this year.”

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage.

PASSED AND APPROVED on the first reading at a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Commerce, Texas on this the 20th day of September, 2022.

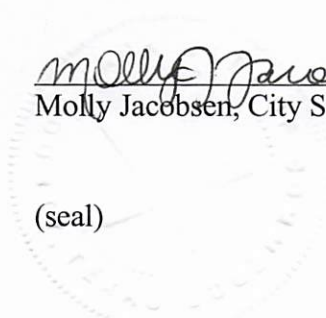
