

RESOLUTION NO. 2022 - 36

A RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE REAPPOINTMENT OF A PART-TIME, MUNICIPAL COURT JUDGE LANA BIGGERSTAFF-ADAMS FOR THE CITY OF COMMERCE; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE THIS RESOLUTION AND AUTHORIZING CITY SECRETARY TO AUTHENTICATE MAYOR'S SIGNATURE TO THIS RESOLUTION; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING A REPEALING CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Commerce, Texas, was held in Commerce, Texas, at City Hall on the 16th day of August 2022, at 6:00 p.m.; a majority of Council Members being present and constituting a quorum, the following resolution was adopted;

WHEREAS, Article 2, Section 13 of the Commerce City Charter says that the Municipal Court Judge for the City of Commerce serves at the pleasure of the Commerce City Council; and

WHEREAS, with the direction and consent of the City Council, Lana Biggerstaff-Adams has been appointed as the Municipal Court Judge for the City of Commerce, in a part-time capacity and has served in that role for the past several years; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Commerce desires to reappoint part-time Municipal Judge Lana Biggerstaff-Adams; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Commerce is of the opinion that Lana Biggerstaff-Adams meets all of the requirements of a Municipal Court Judge, and should be reappointed as a Municipal Court Judge, pursuant to Chapter 2, Section 13 of the City Charter, to be effective September 1, 2022 through; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Commerce that said appointment be confirmed and is hereby confirmed, and that said appointee take office upon taking oath of office as required by law.

SECTION 1. The City Council finds and determines that Lana Biggerstaff-Adams shall be and is hereby appointed as the Municipal Judge of the Municipal Court of the City of Commerce until her reappointment with the appointment beginning September 1, 2022; or until her successor is appointed and qualified. All persons serving as judge, regardless of term, serve at the discretion and pleasure of the City Council.

SECTION 2. Should any word, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this Resolution be adjudged or deemed invalid, void or unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of said Resolution which shall remain in full force and effect.

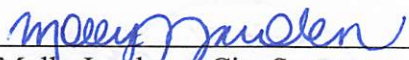
